In Memory of Jim Gilley

James William "Jim" Gilley, 82, went to sleep in the Lord on December 28, 2022 in Clermont, Florida after a month-long battle with Covid pneumonia and Legionnaires' disease. Jim was born in Dallas, Texas on October 17, 1940 to John and Pauline Gilley. He was the fourth of five children who have preceded him in death: Ed, Mary, John and Paul. Raised in Tyler and Dallas, Texas, Jim started his formal education at Southwestern Junior College (now Southwestern Adventist University) in Keene, Texas where he met the love of his life, Camille Thurmon. Married at the age of 19, the two of them began a life of service to God and man. During his first assignment as an assistant pastor of the Village Church in South Lancaster, MA, he also organized the Leominster Church prior to continuing on to the seminary. After graduating from Andrews University in Berrien Springs, MI, Jim went on to pastor the Plainville/Meridian district in Southern New England and later became the Conference Evangelist of the Southern New England Conference. Over his life, he served as a business owner and self-supporting evangelist; Pastor of the Arlington Seventh-day Adventist Church; President of the Arkansas-Louisiana Conference of Seventh-day Adventists; Vice President of the NAD; Pastor of the Dallas First Church; and President of Three Angels Broadcasting Network. Jim spread the love of Jesus through dozens of evangelistic series throughout the United States during the 1970's and 80's as well as in Ukraine during the 90's; as a result, thousands accepted Jesus as their Savior. In his retirement, Jim pastored the Clermont Seventh-day Adventist Church and continued with speaking engagements and hosting over 40 trips to the Holy Land—the highlight of his year. He believed that God had called him to the ministry of encouragement and is known world over for his motto, "Keep on keeping on!" His ministry lives on through his books: *Keep On Keeping On: Encouraging Stories to Carry You*; *The Battle Is the Lord's: Spiritual Strategies for Victory in Your Daily Struggles*; *God With Us*; *God For Us*; *Fake News: How Satan's Lies Are Deceiving Millions*; and *Keep On Keeping On With Jesus: More Encouraging Stories to Help You*. He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Camille; son, James William Gilley, Jr.; daughter, Maryann Catherine Gilley Krueger; son, John Thurmon Gilley; daughter, Amy Camille Gilley Bearman; and his eleven grandchildren whom he adored.

A graveside service was held on January 4, at Highland Memory Gardens in Forest City, FL. and a celebration of Jim's life was held at the Dallas First SDA Church on Sabbath afternoon, February 4, 2023. We look forward to seeing Elder Gilley again when Jesus returns and we are reunited in glory.

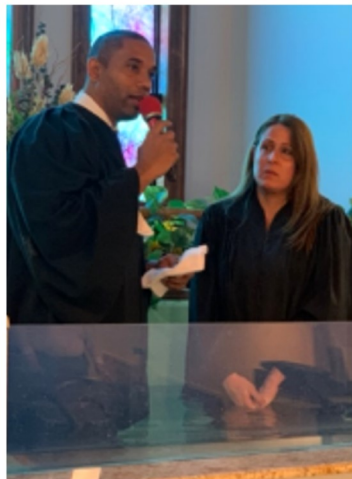

Evangelism is defined as the spreading of the Christian gospel by public preaching or personal witness. The Seventh-day Adventist church is equipped with social media, friendship evangelism, Bible studies and pastors to share the good news of Jesus's love for His children. In this way, many souls are making life changing decisions at the Lake Charles SDA church. **Karen Smith** was born and raised in Lake Charles. She grew up in the Baptist church. One day her son was scrolling through YouTube and listening to different sermons when he landed on a sermon about the Law of God. Karen's son told his mom that she should listen to this. Karen listened to the message and as Walter Veith explained that Saturday was the Sabbath, Karen was captivated by what she heard. All her life she had never heard that Sunday was the first day of the week and Saturday was the seventh day. She continued to listen and searched for more sermons. After listening to other sermons, she decided that she must keep the Sabbath. After a few weeks, she googled which church keeps Sabbath. She learned about the SDA church. So, she searched for an Adventist church near her which happened to be Lake Charles. After three weeks of attending church and reading through the Fundamental Beliefs, she decided she wanted to be baptized and make Lake Charles her new church home. Friendship evangelism brought **Matthew Martin Harris** to Lake Charles SDA Church. Matthew, a client of Church Elder Wade Smith struggled with smoking and health challenges. Falling on hard times, he reached out to Elder Wade who met his

needs and shared the gospel with him. Several weeks went by and again Matthew fell on hard times. This time he was blessed with a financial donation from the church. Elder Wade continued to share the love of Jesus and one Sabbath morning, Matthew called asking for a ride to church. After the service, he stayed for potluck and fellowshiped with many of the members. That day, he asked for Bible study. Through the Discovery Bible lessons, Matthew heard the call of his Savior which prompted him to stand after an appeal for baptism by Pastor Hillis Jeffries. Elder Wade was thankful God used him to help free a soul from sin. **Janice Borden**, a native of the Bay Islands of Honduras, recently moved to Lake Charles for a fresh start. Janice had grown up in a very strict Adventist home and church. Her grandmother, a pillar of the local Adventist church in Honduras, did not want Janice to get baptized at an early age. Janice continued attending church into her adult life. Shortly after arriving at Lake Charles, she started attending Lake Charles SDA church. Janice immediately became actively involved with the activities at the church. Elder Gibson and his wife Darla took a special interest in Janice and would invite her to open the

Sabbath with them at their home. They learned Janice wasn't baptized. And so they started doing Bible studies with her which led to Janice finally made the decision to get baptized. Lake Charles' story doesn't end there. Since the arrival of Pastor Jeffries, God has been moving attendees to make life changing decisions as he verbalizes weekly, "There are special privileges with church membership." This along with many other sermons prompted **James Garrett** to add his name to the church role. Three years ago, James Garrett after listening to the preaching of Doug Bachelor, Kenneth Cox, and Ivor Myers, left his Baptist church because he wanted to keep all God's commandments. He gave up unclean meat (a staple of Louisiana cuisine.) He kept hearing the words of Jesus, "If you love Me, keep My commandments." Since he was already baptized through immersion and a faithful member of his former church, James

joined the Lake Charles church through Affirmation of Faith. James was so excited for the day when he would become a member that he invited his entire family to witness his vows. Evangelism forms the very backbone of our mission. As disciples of Christ we are praising God for the four lives that were obedient to the truths of His word.

SERVICES FOR THE BLIND

Grant Will Increase Braille Access Worldwide

LINCOLN, NE — Christian Record Services (CRS) has received \$597,000 from the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists to increase its braille production capacity. Funding will enable the ministry to add additional production space at its headquarters, purchase additional braille embossing equipment, and add one staff member to meet the increase in production. After a three-year period, CRS expects to cover ongoing costs within its operating budget, which is primarily supported by faithful donors of the ministry. Randy Robinson, Treasurer/CFO for the Seventh-day Adventist Church in North America and member of the CRS Board of Directors, said, “Christian Record Services applied for funding available to all Divisions for ministry, and was awarded the funding, which will be a blessing to the ministry and the people it serves.”

Globally, 1.1 billion people were living with vision loss in 2020, with 43 million who are blind and 295 million who have moderate to severe vision impairment [Source: IAPB]. In 2015, a study estimated 12.44 million people in the United States are blind or have a vision impairment, a number that is expected to double by 2050 [Source: CDC]. It’s not enough to assume people whose preferred reading format is braille have access to the Gospel through other means. Worldwide, there is a significant gap in access to braille and the ability to produce resources in braille for the Adventist church, and for Christian resources in general. With limited capacity to produce braille in other regions of the Adventist Church, CRS is uniquely poised to help meet the growing needs of the global Church.

Diane Thurber, president of CRS, says “We are incredibly grateful to be the recipient of these funds and are excited about the opportunity to expand our production capacity. Resources in braille are not only important to members of the Adventist Church who are blind but can be an important tool for local churches to expand their ministry within their communities, large or small, to people who are blind or experiencing vision loss. With this expansion, we will contribute to braille literacy and address the book famine that currently exists, with less than 10% of published works available in accessible formats in developed countries and less than 1% in undeveloped countries.”

The ministry’s current production capacity enables it to fulfill member requests from within the United States and its territories, and to fulfill current contracted services with Divisions worldwide, which includes the Adult Sabbath School Bible Study Guide and magazines produced by CRS. However, to meet the need of new braille requests, CRS will significantly increase its capacity for producing books and resources in braille and add production capacity for the existing library of braille books and resources that could be offered to the worldwide church by special request through contracted service agreements. It is anticipated the expansion will be completed by late summer 2023.

The mission of CRS is to empower people who are blind to engage their communities and embrace the Blessed Hope. Located in Lincoln, Nebraska, CRS serves nearly 18,000 members throughout the U.S. and in countries around the world, with approximately 10,000 members outside the United States. Membership and services are free to anyone who is legally blind. Outside the United States and its territories, CRS partners with Division leadership, Adventist Possibility Ministries, and Canada conferences through contracted service agreements.

Dr. Nyla Juhl Imler, 70, of Amity AR, died October 31 at 10:13 AM, at Twin Rivers Rehab Center in Arkadelphia, after an extended illness. The courage she demonstrated facing the day-to-day challenges of advanced Multiple Sclerosis, especially the last 10 years, was an inspiration to many. She spent the last years of her illness at home under the care of her husband. She was briefly in the Rehab facility at the time of her death. Born January 26, 1952, the daughter of Willis and Helen (VanTuy) Stigge, Nyla married Richard Juhl in 1975, who died in 1991. In 1995, she married Toby Imler. Nyla graduated from Oak Park Academy in 1970, Union College, Lincoln NE in 1973 as an RN, Loma Linda University in 1976 as a Nurse Practitioner, and from University of Texas Austin with a PhD in 1983. She spent her most of her career as a professor in nursing education, at Loma Linda University, University of North Dakota, and the Universities of Minnesota. In 2004, after retiring from their work in Minnesota, she and her husband served on the faculty at Ouachita Hills Academy/College in Amity until 2011. She loved to challenge students to think and left a huge impact on many who have become teachers and pastors. As a lifetime Seventh Day Adventist, and member at Amity, her love for Jesus was profound and there is nothing she would not give for Him.

An Encounter with Adventist Education

On January 21, 2023, the administration, staff, and K-8th students at Ozark Adventist School prepared and led the entire worship service at the Gentry SDA Church in Gentry, Arkansas. The service included a slideshow testimonial of the students and their experiences throughout the first semester of the year. Students shared the children's story, rendered a memory verse recital, and sang beautiful music in both Spanish and English. The staff and their families led out in the preliminaries and the sermon was presented by the Principal, Mrs. Tara Bailey, along with the 7th and 8th grade classes. The sanctuary was transformed into a Bible classroom and the congregation was able to experience a lesson from North American Division's recently adopted Bible Encounter Curriculum for Adventist Bible classes. Mrs. Bailey, a certified trainer for the Encounter Curriculum, presented the two-fold objective for the morning's Bible class. The essential question: How does God get my attention? The Big Idea: God sometimes gets our attention by sending people to us with a message from Him. These objectives were met by intentionally focusing on the important fact that God does not give up on bringing us to His side but continues to call for us to come to Him! To begin the lesson, the congregation was presented an

important note: *Talking is not teaching and listening is not learning. Your involvement will seal your learning.* The congregation instantly involved themselves in an interactive lesson on the prophet Elijah and how important it is to answer when God calls. They were able to share the

power of a Bible story and make discoveries for themselves. Real life encounters in Scripture were recalled and they were able to reflect on how we can make God's Word central in our lives. The student speakers shared their research on Biblical examples of God's call to different individuals in the Bible, messages from God provided in the story of Elijah, and how the division of God's people resulted in the reign of good and bad kings. All of this emphasized how important it is to trust God as He leads. The message culminated with a demonstration of how distractions in this world take us from the Lord's side and far from hearing His call. The demonstration included the three 8th grade students holding a bowl that represented Elijah, Baal, and Ashtoreth. Each bowl held small balls that represented the nation of Israel. As Elijah took balls from the other bowls, Baal and Ashtoreth could simultaneously take balls from his bowl. This was to illustrate how distractions and sin in our lives take us away from God. At the conclusion of the message, everyone received an invitation to choose Christ above all other things in this world.

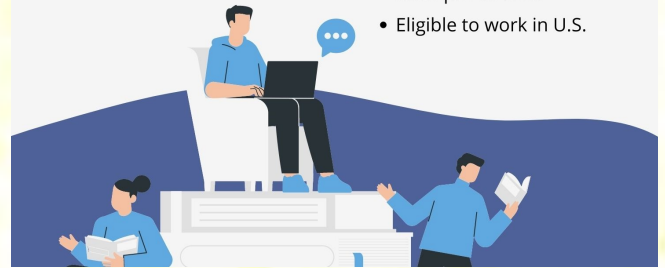

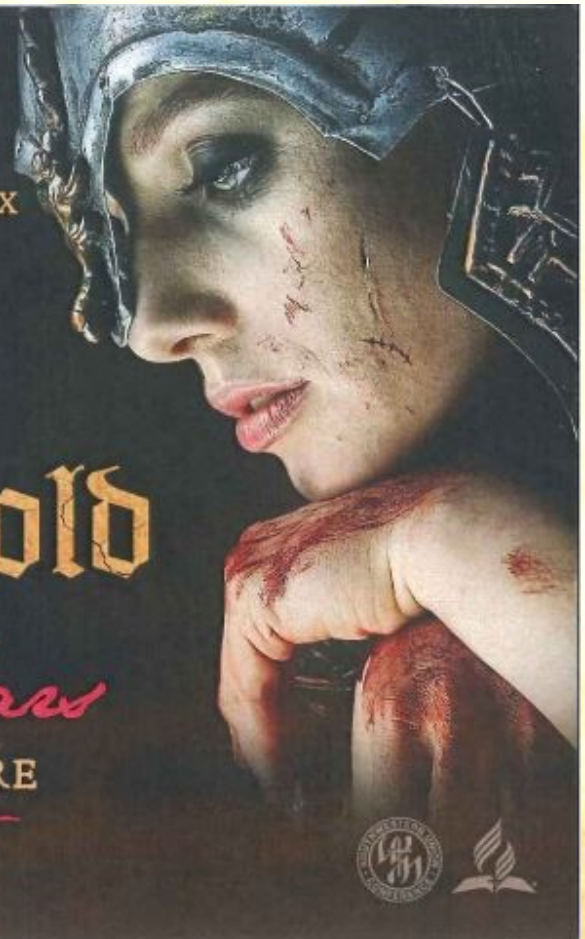


